

# Minutes

Pacific City-Woods Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) Meeting  
Pacific Coast Bible Church  
Saturday, February 17, 2018 at 10:30am

PC-W CAC meetings provide citizens an opportunity to interact with all community members on issues important to our area. Everyone is encouraged to participate.

1. Attendance – 27 people
2. Guest Speaker: Doug Pilant – General Manager of Transportation for Tillamook County, *The Challenges and Future of Transportation in Tillamook County*  
Started in 2012 here in Tillamook County. Part of the NW Transit Alliance. Provide transportation service between Lincoln City and Salem as part of the partnership between the Siletz Indian Tribe and Grand Ronde Tribe. Recently adopted pet policy with Lincoln County. Also working with Lincoln County to coordinate their holiday closures. Buses operate seven days a week except for the six main holidays. Also expanded service from Neskowin to Chinook Winds. May 2012 started offering non-emergency medical transportation services, which allows transportation out of the county for medical appointments. Long Range Transportation Plan is an 18 month plan, which looks at future needs of the county and needed improvements. Provide an amount of funding to CARE to provide bus passes to low income senior citizens and persons with disabilities. Provide some funding to Mary Mills Center for transportation of their clients. Currently are working on making three round trips to Portland each day instead of two.  
Offer transport from Lincoln City to Cannon Beach, also to Portland and Salem.  
From July 1 – Labor day a free transport was offered in Pacific City last year on Saturdays and Sundays. Intend to do it next summer as well with improvements to the system of operation.  
You can also flag the bus down where ever you are if you need a ride but haven't gotten to the designated bus stop.
3. Minutes of the January 15, 2018 General Membership Meeting and the February 3, 2018 Emergency CAC Meeting – Megan Gillas, secretary  
Anne Price, move to approve both minutes from January 15 and February 3. Seconded by Barb Taylor. All in favor. Approved.
4. County Updates
  - a. County Parks Advisory Committee  
Parks system paid \$122,000 in TLT funds last year. Our peak months for parks are July and August. In those months parks receive 50% of their income in those two months. June and September receive 25% of their annual income.  
Income from last year was \$2.8 million.  
Looking to purchase property and open a large campground in south county.

Whalen Island was shut down for the entire year, but the overall income is still on to be the same as previous years.

b. County Roads Advisory Committee

A ditching machine is coming from Hood River County in a few months, so the ditches can start being cleared out throughout the county.

DEQ issued a type 401 violations for both the Lommen bridge and the Whalen Island bridge. Both bridges are/were constructed by the same contractor. The fines are the county's responsibility even though the problem was caused by the contractor. A 401 violations has to do with sediment leaving the job site and going into a water way. The problem has been taken care of. Whalen Island bridge is set to be done by April 30.

Resort Drive needs a bio-engineered bank. Half the road will have to be taken up in order to install the new bank. Road will be closed for probably 2 days, but no date for project is set yet. Hopefully before tourist season.

At the meeting I reported some of the larger pot holes that have formed along our main roads in Pacific City. A crew came out on Wednesday and filled those pot holes, as well as some others that I did not mention!

Our next meeting will be on Monday, April 2 at 3pm in the Tillamook County Courthouse in room B.
